(a) Forgiveness.—Notwithstanding any other pro-

9 vision of law, all indebtedness of the Administrator of the

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Federal Emergency Management Agency under any notes or other obligations issued pursuant to section 1309(a) of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3 4 4016(a)) and section 15(e) of the Federal Insurance Act of 1956 (42 U.S.C. 2414(e)), and outstanding as of September 30, 2016, is hereby canceled, the Administrator 6 and the National Flood Insurance Fund are relieved of 8 all liability to the Secretary of the Treasury under any such notes or other obligations, including for any interest due under such notes and any other fees and charges pay-10 11 able in connection with such notes, and the total amount 12 of notes and obligations issued by the Administrator pursuant to such section shall be considered to be reduced by such amount for purposes of the limitation on such 14 15 total amount under such section. 16 (b) Treatment of Canceled Debt.—The amount of the indebtedness canceled under subsection (a)— 18 (1) may be treated as a public debt of the 19 United States; and 20 (2) is designated as an emergency pursuant to 21 section 4(g) of 6 the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act 22 of 2010 (2 U.S.C. 7 933(g)).
